Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibilities to support children's individual needs and interests across all areas of learning. She is aware of how to observe and assess children's development to plan activities that are challenging. She knows how to complete a progress check for children when aged between two and three years.
- The childminder recognises the need to work in partnerships with parents and share information with them to provide a consistent approach to learning.
- The childminder is aware of how to develop attachments with children to help them settle quickly and feel ready to learn.
- The childminder understands how to identify and report any safeguarding concerns she has about children's safety and welfare.
- The childminder recognises the importance of evaluating her practice and attending ongoing training that will help her build her knowledge and skills, to support positive outcomes for children.
- The childminder has a range of resources and activities ready for children that are suitable for children of all ages and stages of learning and development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about how she intends to support children's progress and development, and meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector sampled a range of documents, including, policies and procedures.
