Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to keep children safe and secure. She attends training in child protection and knows the action to take if concerned a child may be at risk. The childminder minimises any risks and makes sure her home is safe and well organised.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements. She knows how to observe, assess and plan for children's needs and future moves on to school.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working with parents to help support children's individual needs consistently. She plans to work in partnership with children's parents and with other providers where children attend more than one setting.
- The childminder understands the importance of how to manage and promote children's behaviour in a positive way. She has clear plans to promote children's physical and emotional well-being and plans to help them gradually move from home into her care.
- The childminder shows a good knowledge and understanding of how to manage her provision. She is well qualified and is aware of the importance of maintaining her professional development, in order to support continuous improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises with the childminder. She discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder. She sampled relevant documentation that the childminder uses when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and viewed the suitability checks for adults living on the premises.

The childminder was registered in 1992. She lives near Aston Flamville, Leicestershire. The childminding provision operates alongside the separate registration for childcare on domestic premises. The childminder has a relevant qualification at level 3. She occasionally works with an assistant. The childminder operates all year round from 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday, except for the bank holidays and family holidays.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register.
