Information about this children's home

This home is owned by a private company. It provides residential care for up to five children who experience social and emotional difficulties.

The manager has been in post since May 2025 and has applied to register with Ofsted.

This monitoring visit

Shortly after the last full inspection on 11 October 2022, managers decided to temporarily stop operating the home until they could recruit adequate staffing.

The home is currently subject to a condition that requires the provider to give Ofsted three months' notice before any children move in. The provider informed Ofsted on 28 May 2025 that the home is now ready to reopen.

The purpose of this visit was to monitor the action taken and the progress made by the home since its last inspection and review its readiness to reopen.

The organisation has successfully recruited a staff team in preparation for the home's reopening. Staff members are currently redeployed across other children's homes in the organisation, where they are acquiring valuable experience and developing their skills.

All staff members have successfully completed the organisation's mandatory training. This helps to equip them with the core skills and knowledge necessary to meet children's needs safely and effectively. In addition, there is an induction programme

in place for any new staff who join the team. This ensures that by the time the home reopens, the staff will be well prepared for their roles.

Children living at the home will have access to a clinical team that provides therapeutic input tailored to their individual needs. The clinical team will also support staff to enable them to provide trauma-informed support to children.

Leaders have ensured that recruitment practices are safe. All required pre-employment checks are consistently carried out before staff start working at the home. This helps leaders assure themselves that only safe adults work at the home.

There has been significant investment in the home to create a warm, welcoming and child-centred environment. The physical space has been designed and furnished to ensure that it is comfortable and homely. However, the garden area requires further work to ensure children's safety, as areas of overgrowth currently present potential hazards.

As a result of this visit, Ofsted lifted the condition that requires the provider to give three months' notice before any children move into the home.
