Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is an experienced and enthusiastic practitioner. She intends to continually evaluate the provision and to support her professional development.
- The childminder has up-to-date knowledge of current and wider safeguarding issues. She knows how to report any concerns about children's welfare to relevant agencies.
- The childminder has a wide range of indoor and outdoor toys that she will make available for children to use. She plans to organise activities that capture children's interest and imagination.
- The childminder knows how to observe and monitor children's learning to help them make progress from their starting points.
- The childminder aims to work with parents and other professionals to establish a consistent approach in children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands how to support children's personal development, including how to manage their behaviour. She intends to take children on outings to help develop their understanding of different communities and cultures.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed all areas of the home, including outdoors. She discussed equipment and toys that are available to be used for childminding.
- The inspector asked to sample relevant policies and documents, including the childminder's first-aid certificate and the suitability of all adults in the household.
- The inspector discussed how the childminder reviews her provision.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to observe and monitor children's progress. She spoke with the childminder about how she plans to deliver the educational programmes for children.
