This home is run by a privately owned company. It is registered to provide care and accommodation for up to two children who have experienced adverse childhood experiences.

The home has been without a registered manager since September 2020. A new manager has been appointed to the home. The manager has not yet applied to register with Ofsted.

The effectiveness of the home and the progress and experiences of children and young people since the most recent full inspection

This home has not yet had a full inspection.
At this interim inspection the home was 'not judged'.

The home was registered in November 2019. No children have lived at the home since November 2020. Ofsted last visited the home in September 2021 to conduct a monitoring visit. The report is published on the Ofsted website.

The inspector spoke to the responsible individual of the provider on the telephone.

Annual health and safety checks remain current, and no issues have been identified relating to the environment since Ofsted's last visit to the home. An independent visitor visits the home monthly and has not identified any issues or concerns.

The provider is in the process of recruiting members of staff for the home. A thorough induction programme is in place to help support and develop all new staff. Safer recruitment checks are in place to ensure that adults are safe to care for children.

The three requirements raised at the previous monitoring visit were not considered as part of this inspection and have been restated.
