Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good knowledge of safeguarding procedures. She is able to identify concerns about a child's welfare and knows how to escalate concerns to appropriate agencies.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the early years foundation stage requirements. She knows how to support children's learning to help them make progress in their overall development.
- The childminder understands the importance of setting boundaries to help promote positive behaviour. She explains how to support children's emotional well-being to help build self-esteem and how to encourage them to explore in their play.
- The childminder knows how to provide a safe environment. She completes risk assessments of her home, and of the surrounding area, before outings to help keep children safe in her care.
- The childminder values input from others, such as parents and a childminding coordinator, to help evaluate her practice. She develops her professional knowledge to continually improve her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
