## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to reflect and evaluate on her practice in order to improve the quality of her setting. She has addressed actions raised at the last inspection and holds a paediatric first-aid certificate.
- The childminder understands her role to safeguard and protect children within her care. She has knowledge of child protection issues and she is aware of the procedures to report any safeguarding concerns.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents, to share information and to promote continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands how to provide children with activities that are interesting. She has a varied selection of resources and equipment to offer children to help them make progress for future learning.
- The childminder knows how to support children's emotional well-being. She understands how to promote children's independence and self-confidence.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to provide activities and experiences that promote children's learning.
- The inspector looked at the childminder's policies and documents she intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her processes for self-evaluation and her improvement plan.

The childminder registered in 1993. She lives in Plaistow, within the London Borough of Newham. The childminder operates on weekdays, throughout most of the year. The childminder holds an early years qualification at level 3. There were no children on roll at the time of inspection.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
