Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to help children to behave. For example, she knows how to teach children about boundaries and to offer positive praise.
- The childminder knows her responsibility to promote children's safety and well-being and protect them from harm. She understands the procedure to follow should she have a concern about a child.
- The childminder understands how to plan activities to meet children's individual needs for them to progress in their learning and development.
- The childminder reflects on her practice, taking account of the views of parents and older children to help her improve her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke to the childminder about her knowledge of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector sampled documents, including the safeguarding policy and learning journals.
- The inspector had a tour of the premises that would be used for looking after children.
- The inspector looked at resources available for children's play.
