Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the learning and development and welfare requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage. She also meets the requirements of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder has a good range of resources for children to choose from when planning their own play experiences. She has considered how she would provide children with opportunities for learning across all seven areas of learning.
- The childminder has thought about how she would monitor children's ongoing development and what systems she would need to use in order to do this successfully.
- The childminder understands the importance of keeping children safe from harm. She has attended safeguarding and first-aid training and has policies and procedures to help safeguard children, which she intends to share with parents.
- The childminder has considered how she will teach children about leading healthy lives through regular exercise and eating well-balanced meals to promote their well-being.
- The childminder has planned how she intends to involve parents in children's development. She understands the significance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to share information about children's ongoing needs.
- The childminder has systems prepared, which she will use to help review her practice to identify her strengths and possible areas for improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
