Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibilities to safeguard children's welfare and has attended child protection training. She knows how to respond to any signs that a child might be at risk of harm.
- The childminder knows how to provide a safe environment. She maintains her first-aid qualification and public liability insurance.
- The childminder understands the importance of helping children develop skills to support their future learning and the move to school. For example, she knows how to help children develop their self-confidence, independence and behaviour.
- The childminder knows the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals, to help meet children's individual care, learning and development needs.
- The childminder knows how to assess, plan and support children's learning, to challenge them and help them make progress in all areas of learning and development.
- The childminder recognises the value of professional development and evaluating her provision to make ongoing improvements to support children's outcomes.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to promote children's learning and development and work in partnership with parents.
- The inspector assessed the childminder's knowledge and understanding of the requirements.
- The inspector looked at the documents the childminder plans to use when caring for children and discussed her policies.
- The inspector looked at the space available for childminding and discussed the resources the childminder intends to provide.
