Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to support children's learning, including how to monitor their development, and plan challenging and exciting activities to support their individual needs and interests.
- The childminder knows how to protect children's welfare. For example, she is aware of the signs and symptoms that may cause her concern, and she knows the procedures to follow to report them.
- The childminder understands how to support healthy lifestyles, including children's understanding of safe practices. For example, by providing opportunities for physical activity and raising children's awareness of personal safety while on outings.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals, to support children's overall care and learning needs.
- The childminder recognises the importance of evaluating her practice and keeping up to date with childcare practices. She regularly engages with other childminders and the local childminding development worker to keep herself fully informed.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector engaged in discussions with the childminder about her understanding of the early years foundation stage and her practice.
- The inspector observed all areas of the home used for childminding.
- The inspector sampled a range of documentation, including the childminder's training certificates, and some of her policies and procedures.

The childminder registered in 1997. She lives in Edgware, in the London Borough of Barnet. The childminder is available to care for children Monday to Friday, from 8am to 6pm, all year round, apart from a few Bank holidays, and during the Christmas period and summer holidays. During the inspection, there are no children on roll.
