

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 2 February 2023, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice on 7 February 2023. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 17 November 2023:

- ensure the area where meals, snacks and drinks are prepared, for children, has suitable facilities for the hygienic preparation of food
- make certain that the premises and equipment meets the needs of children, ensuring the play space is fit for purpose and organised to promote free flow play and child-initiated learning, and ensure you comply with health and safety legislation
- take all reasonable steps to minimise or remove risks in all areas used by children and ensure that all facilities are fit for purpose, this refers to used mops, bucket, low level glass, propped ladders and door, regular cleaning of the nappy changing mat and the leaking toilet
- ensure that animal bedding and feed is out of reach of children and put in place a risk assessment relating to minimising the risk of cross infection from all pets living in the household
- ensure that emergency exits are kept clear to provide swift emergency exit or access
- make certain that there is a record for each child that includes their full name, date of birth; name and address of every parent and/or carer who is known (and information about any other person who has parental responsibility for the child); which parent(s) and/or carer(s) the child normally lives with, and emergency contact details for parents

and/or carers

- ensure all records, required by legislation, are in place and maintained correctly, this refers maintain a daily record of children names and their hours of attendance
- update safeguarding knowledge to ensure that you are clear about the main categories of abuse and know who your local agencies are that have
- focus professional development on raising the quality of teaching to ensure that the learning and development experiences for children continually improves.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

On 23 February 2023 we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider had taken appropriate steps to address the actions. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare and actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
