Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The provider and manager have a secure understanding of the need to plan exciting and challenging activities, based on children's interests.
- The provider has interesting resources that are attractively displayed so children can easily access them.
- Staff have a secure knowledge of the need to promote healthy lifestyles through good exercise and a nutritious diet. They understand that children benefit from play and exercise in the fresh air.
- The manager and most of the staff have current paediatric first-aid training. Staff who work with young children have the skills and knowledge to manage accidents or emergencies quickly.
- The provider and manager understand the importance of evaluating the service. They reflect on ways to implement improvements to benefit children, with input from all of the users.
- The provider understands about taking effective action to ensure the safety of children. She has trained the staff to ensure they have knowledge of what to do if they have child protection concerns about children in their care. The manager completes risk assessments to minimise potential hazards.
- The provider has good recruitment and induction systems to follow to help ensure all staff are suitable. All staff are fully aware of their roles and responsibilities.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises available for children.
- The inspector viewed the different resources available and discussed with the provider about how they would use them to promote children's enjoyment.
- The inspector sampled a range of policies and documents that the provider will use when caring for children.
- The inspector checked the suitability and training of the provider, manager and staff.
