Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements and knows how to plan and provide suitable activities to meet all children's individual needs and interests and prepare them for school.
- The childminder has commitment to improvement. She has addressed recommendations and actions made at the last inspection. She has developed her knowledge of the Early Years Foundation Stage requirements. She maintains the required documentation and completes risk assessments, including for outings. She has developed her systems for self-evaluation.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of safeguarding children. She is aware of possible indicators of abuse and is familiar with local safeguarding procedures to follow in the event of having a concern about a child.
- The childminder understands how to provide a clean and suitable environment to ensure children's good health is protected, and knows how to meet their physical needs.
- The childminder understands the importance of continually evaluating her service and attends relevant training to develop her knowledge. The childminder understands the required documentation, which must be maintained.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed all areas of the home used for childminding and viewed resources that are available for children.
- The inspector sampled documentation and discussed the policies and procedures the childminder uses when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she delivers the educational programmes and provides an appropriate learning environment to meet children's needs, interests and abilities.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she evaluates her provision to drive improvement and viewed the childminder's written self-evaluation.
