## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not have a paediatric first-aid qualification.
- The childminder demonstrates a thorough understanding of the learning and development requirements. She knows how to observe and assess children's learning, in order to plan activities that provide suitable challenge that help them make good progress.
- The childminder acknowledges the importance of working closely with parents and sharing information with them regarding all aspects of their children's learning and care.
- The childminder demonstrates through discussion that she has a good understanding of how to safeguard children in her care. She is confident to take action to protect children's welfare in the event of a child protection concern.
- The childminder recognises the importance of helping children to follow healthy hygiene routines. She knows how to support them to develop their independence and understands how this helps them to be ready for school.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder registered in 1992. She operates all year round, Monday to Friday, except for bank holidays and family holidays.
