Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder explains how she keeps her home clean and tidy for children. She describes how she undertakes regular risk assessments to identify and address any potential hazards, to keep children safe and secure. The childminder discusses how she provides toys for children to play with that are appropriate to their age and stage of development.
- The childminder discusses how she undertakes most of her childminding activity in her living room and garden. She explains that children will have the opportunity to choose whether they play indoors or outside. The childminder plans to take children to visits parks and playgrounds in the area, where they can extend their physical skills.
- The childminder describes how parents complete a settling-in form to provide information about their children's likes and interests when they first start. She explains how she will use her observations and assessments to establish what children know and can do. The childminder understands that this will help her to plan effectively to support children to make good progress in their learning.
- The childminder explains how she manages children's behaviour by setting clear expectations. She talks about how she will help children to be considerate of others, help their peers and share resources. The childminder describes how this will help children understand boundaries and develop friendships with others.
- The childminder describes how children will enjoy a wide range of food in her home. She will prepare fresh, home-cooked meals for children and ensure that they eat well. The childminder explains that she will help children to learn about nutritious food, and being active to stay well and healthy.
- When it is time to teach children important independence skills, such as using the toilet, the childminder explains how she will work with parents. She discusses how this will ensure that there is continuity for children and a good routine in place to ensure successful outcomes.
- The childminder has a good understanding of child protection. She knows who to contact should she have any concerns about the welfare of a child. The childminder accesses regular training to keep her knowledge up to date. This means that the childminder has the information she needs to promote children's best interests.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The childminder provided the inspector with a sample of key documentation on request.
- The inspector assessed the childminder's knowledge and understanding of safeguarding issues and how she manages any concerns.
