This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to support children's learning. She knows what skills will support children as they prepare to move on to the next stage in their education. The childminder understands the importance of planning a range of activities and experiences to support children's learning. She has a variety of resources to engage children in their play and learning.
- The childminder knows how to encourage and support children's positive behaviour. She understands the importance of working with parents and other settings that children attend to provide consistency for children.
- The childminder plans to support children to develop a healthy and active lifestyle. She understands the need to supply nutritious food for children and provide them with daily opportunities to play and learn outdoors.
- The childminder understands her role to keep children safe and promote their well-being at all times. She has secure knowledge of child protection and wider safeguarding issues. The childminder knows the procedures to report any concerns she may have about children's welfare.
- The childminder plans to reflect and evaluate the service she provides. She understands the importance of keeping her skills and knowledge up to date to help her provide the best quality of care and education for children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
