The quality and standards of the early years provision

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage to enable her to plan effectively for children's individual needs. She has good arrangements in place to identify children's starting points in order to track their progress across the areas of learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing secure partnerships with parents, carers and others to meet children's individual needs. Ongoing daily discussions and use of a communication book ensure that important information is readily shared with parents and children's continuity of care is promoted.
- The childminder demonstrates effective settling-in procedures to help support children's transition into the childminding setting.
- Children are safeguarded because the childminder understands her role and responsibilities in protecting children from harm. She follows required procedures to ensure all those living or working on the premises are suitable to do so. Furthermore, she is clear about the role of her assistant and ensures that correct ratios are maintained at all times.
- The childminder monitors and evaluates her practice. She is aware of her strengths and identifies some areas for development which continue to improve the provision for children. She demonstrates a clear commitment to attending ongoing training and promoting her own professional development.
- Children's safety is given due consideration. The childminder attends child protection training regularly, and diligently carries out risk assessments in the home and during outings to ensure all risks to children's safety are fully minimised.

Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle – the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children on roll when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children on roll, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector toured the ground floor of the childminder's home and viewed the play equipment.
- The inspector looked at planning documentation, the childminder's self-evaluation form and some written policy documents.
- The inspector viewed evidence of suitability and qualifications of the childminder and her assistant.

Information about the setting

The childminder was registered in 1999 and is on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. She lives with her partner and two children aged five weeks and 20 years in a house in Trimley St. Martin, Suffolk. The whole of the ground floor and the rear garden is used for childminding. The family has a pet dog.

The childminder collects children from the local school. She regularly works with an assistant. There are currently five children on roll, who attend for a variety of sessions. These children are in the later years age group. At the time of this inspection, there were no children on roll in the early years age range. The childminding service operates all year round from 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, except bank holidays and family holidays. The childminder is a member of the Professional Association for Childcare and Early Years.

Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

The Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills (Ofsted) regulates and inspects to achieve excellence in the care of children and young people, and in education and skills for learners of all ages. It regulates and inspects childcare and children's social care, and inspects the Children and Family Court Advisory Support Service (Cafcass), schools, colleges, initial teacher training, work-based learning and skills training, adult and community learning, and education and training in prisons and other secure establishments.
