Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder explains how she will use a range of teaching strategies to meet children's specific learning and development needs. She shares how she will monitor the progress that children make to identify any gaps in their learning so additional support can be provided. The childminder describes how she will work in partnership with parents. She plans to share information about children's progress with their parents, and help them to support their children's learning at home.
- The childminder explains how she will evaluate her provision. She describes how she intends to seek advice and support from local authority advisers and seek parents' feedback. The childminder recognises the significance of carrying out risk assessments. Through discussion, she demonstrates how she will maintain a safe and secure environment for all children. She ensures her paediatric first-aid qualification is valid at all times, and her public liability insurance is renewed annually.
- Through discussion, the childminder demonstrates a good understanding of how to safeguard children. She describes the procedures she will follow if she has any concerns about a child's welfare. She shares how she will keep her safeguarding knowledge up to date. She describes possible signs that may indicate when a child may need protection, such as from neglect, abuse, and exposure to extreme views or behaviours.
- The childminder explains how she will build secure attachments with children to promote their confidence and well-being. Through discussion, she shows a good knowledge of positive behaviour management and understands how to support children's good behaviour. The childminder explains how she will help children to develop positive relationships and to be polite and respectful to others. She describes how she will provide an inclusive provision.
- The childminder describes how she will promote children's physical development and the importance of living a healthy lifestyle. The childminder intends to provide plenty of opportunities for children to play outside and support their growing independence.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the provider received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider, and has taken that into account in her evaluation of the provider.
- The inspector had a tour of the premises and viewed all areas, including outdoors, that are used when caring for children.
- The inspector held discussions with childminder about the records she will keep when she is childminding, including evidence of her qualifications and her suitability.
- The inspector talked to the childminder about how she will keep children safe and protect them from potential harm.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her knowledge and skills related to the early years foundation stage.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
