Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is clear on the procedures for safeguarding children. She has a child protection policy in place and has renewed her safeguarding training to update her knowledge. The childminder is fully aware about the action to take should she have any concerns about children's welfare. This helps to keep children safe in her care.
- The childminder understands the importance of planning stimulating activities for a range of different children's age groups. She discusses how she will provide enjoyable experiences for children of different abilities to challenge their thinking and promote their overall development.
- The childminder's home is warm and welcoming. She explains how children will take part in activities at her home and during outings, to support their well-being, physical and language development. The childminder discusses the importance of providing healthy food and promoting good hygiene routines. She explains how she is keen to encourage children to develop respect for all living things and their environment.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and other providers. She describes how this will help to develop a shared approach to meeting children's care and learning needs, to support the next stage in children's learning, such as school.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour in a positive way. She describes the strategies she will use to help to build children's confidence and self-esteem. The childminder recognises the significance of providing an inclusive service.
- The childminder describes the importance of building caring relationships with children. She explains how she will help to develop children's social skills, and encourage them to respect any differences between themselves and others.
- The childminder holds public liability insurance and a current paediatric first-aid certificate. She keeps all of the required documentation for the safe and efficient management of her setting organised well. The childminder discusses how she will complete thorough risk assessments of her home and the resources available.
- The childminder understands the importance of continuing her professional development. She knows the importance of continually evaluating her practice to improve the service she offers. The childminder describes how she will include the views of children and parents, to assist in identifying areas for further improvement.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the provider received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector checked evidence of the childminder's public liability insurance, training certificates, including evidence of the childminder's suitability and the suitability of all people living on the premises.
- The inspector looked at policies and documents the childminder will use when caring for children and discussed self-evaluation plans.
- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises and outdoor area where childcare will be provided. She also viewed and discussed the available resources.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
