Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows the importance of planning activities to support all areas of children's development. She describes how she will communicate with parents to find out children's starting points. She understands how to assess children's abilities to identify extra support they may need to help them develop.
- The childminder explains how she will help children to manage their behaviour, share and develop good relationships. She describes how she will support older children to help younger children with managing their feelings and routines of the day.
- The childminder understands how to help children develop a healthy lifestyle through the food they eat and exercise. She explains how she will provide opportunities for physically active play in local parks, playgroups and on her premises. She describes how she will provide a daily home-cooked meal to encourage healthy eating and exposure to different tastes.
- The childminder continues to keep her safeguarding knowledge up to date. She demonstrates that she knows what to do if a child is at risk of harm. The childminder understands how she will keep her premises secure and carry out risk assessments on site and on trips out to keep children safe.
- The childminder recognises the importance of continuing her professional development. For example, she has accessed recent training on child development. She recognises the importance of evaluating her setting and the service she provides.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
