Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to provide a suitable curriculum and learning opportunities for children when they attend. She understands how to monitor children's development and plan for their individual needs and interests. She knows how to help children develop skills, in preparation for their eventual move to school. The childminder recognises the importance of providing an inclusive and welcoming service.
- The childminder describes how she will support children's understanding of healthy lifestyles. She explains she will provide nutritious food and promote good oral health. She explains how she will provide opportunities for children to play in the garden and visit local parks, for fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder understands her responsibilities to keep children safe. She knows how to recognise possible signs of abuse and understands how to report concerns to the relevant agencies. She completes regular risk assessments to ensure children remain safe in her care when they attend.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to provide a consistent approach and support to children's care and learning. The childminder describes how she will share information with parents about children's learning and identify ways they can support their children at home.
- The childminder recognises the importance of professional development and strives for continuous improvement. Since registration, the childminder has extended her knowledge through ongoing training.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements and how to monitor and plan for children's individual needs.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspectors completed a learning walk across all areas of the setting to understand how the early years provision and curriculum is organised when children attend.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about how she works with parents and other professionals when children attend.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
