Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a clear understanding of how to safeguard children. She knows the possible signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect and how to refer any concerns to the relevant authorities.
- The childminder's premises are well organised with appropriate resources. The childminder carries out regular risk assessments and puts any necessary measures in place to keep children safe.
- The childminder explains how she uses a range of teaching skills to meet children's individual learning styles and to support her curriculum. She has systems in place to observe and to monitor children's progress and to identify any gaps in their learning.
- The childminder has high expectations for children's behaviour. She explains how she sets clear expectations for children's behaviour and praises them when they show expected behaviours.
- The childminder understands the importance of encouraging children to adopt a healthy lifestyle through being physically active and spending time outdoors.
- The childminder explains how she keeps her knowledge and practice up to date. For example, she contacts local authority advisors if there are any queries and attends regular webinars and other training opportunities by relevant organisations.
- The childminder understands the importance of building strong parent partnerships. She has systems in place to communicate children's progress and what they have been doing during the day.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
