Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has not had any minded children attend since registration. However, she has ensured that she has kept herself up to date with all statutory requirements, including accessing paediatric first-aid training and updating Disclosure and Barring Service checks for household members.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge and understanding of how to keep children safe. She has undertaken recent online safeguarding courses and knows when, and who, to report any concerns she has about a child, including any allegations made against herself or a household member. The childminder knows her responsibilities to safeguard children from radical and extreme views or behaviours.
- The childminder demonstrates a robust understanding of how children learn and develop. She knows how to identify and support a child to make progress from their starting points. The childminder accurately explained activities that she could do and adapt to ensure all children make progress, including those with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND).
- The childminder demonstrated how she would assess risk and accurately described how she would minimise or reduce these when minded children are present, including safe access to the internet.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of how to manage children's behaviour. She is in the process of accessing further training to increase her own learning and to support all children effectively, including those with SEND.
- The childminder understands how to support children's health. She will provide children with regular opportunities for physical and active play. The childminder understands the importance of supporting children's dietary requirements and will gain this information from parents when the child starts.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the childminder received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the childminder and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the setting.
- Documentation was sampled to ensure the childminder was meeting the requirements of registration, which included public liability insurance.
- The childminder explained to the inspector how she will meet the learning and development requirements, including giving examples of activities she would use for each age and stage of children.
- The inspector and childminder reviewed all areas of the home, including those inside and outside that will be accessed by children to ensure that they are safe.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
