

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 9 September 2025, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice on 12 September 2025. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 26 September 2025:

- ensure that you provide Ofsted with the required information to complete the suitability checks of individuals who represent the organisation
- ensure that all staff, including the setting's lead practitioner for safeguarding, have a secure knowledge and understanding of the procedures to escalate concerns, particularly when a referral needs to be made to outside agencies
- ensure that staff are supported to refresh and maintain the knowledge and skills required to implement their roles and responsibilities effectively, particularly with regards to safeguarding children.

On 29 September 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection. We found that the provider had provided Ofsted with the required information to complete the suitability checks for relevant people in the organisation. This helps to ensure that those who may be in regular contact with children are suitable for their roles. The provider has taken appropriate steps to improve staff knowledge of the procedures to follow to escalate child protection matters to relevant outside agencies. The provider has strengthened support for staff to ensure they are trained to implement their safeguarding responsibilities. These improvements help to safeguard children and ensure their welfare. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
