Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder explains how he continually improves his professional knowledge and skills. For example, he has support from the local authority adviser and attends childminder network meetings. He describes how this helps to further enhance his understanding of children's learning and development.
- The childminder details how he will provide a challenging curriculum for children, which helps to prepare them for later life. For instance, he explains how he will help children to learn about different people and communities, such as by celebrating various cultural events throughout the year.
- The childminder has a range of suitable resources for children of different ages. He explains how he will plan a variety of interesting and appealing activities, to promote children's love of learning. For example, the childminder describes how he will use physical games and interactive electronic toys, to help children learn about numbers.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's health and well-being. For instance, he explains how he will use his experience in catering, to ensure that meals for children are nutritionally balanced. The childminder plans to provide daily exercise for children in his large garden. He describes how this will support children's strength, balance and bodily control.
- The childminder understands his responsibility to provide safe learning environments for children, inside and outside of his home. He explains how he uses regular checks and risk assessments, to minimise or eliminate any hazards.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of different types and signs of child abuse. He is confident about the processes to follow, should he have concerns about children's welfare, or if an allegation is made about him or a member of his household.
- The childminder describes how he will work closely with parents, to ensure there is consistency in children's care and learning. He explains the importance of regular communication and how he will achieve this, such as through conversations and by sharing information using an online app.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The childminder showed the inspector the areas of his home that he intends to use for childminding. He explained how he ensures it is safe and suitable for children.
