Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Through discussion, the childminder shows an understanding of how to keep children safe. She describes the procedures she will follow should she have concerns about a child's welfare. This includes working with relevant agencies.
- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of the learning and development requirements. She describes how she will make observations and assessments of children and use this information to plan appropriate experiences to meet their individual developmental needs.
- The childminder describes how she will complete the required assessments. For example, she talks about how she will undertake progress checks for children aged between two and three years in consultation with parents.
- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of the importance of supporting children to be healthy and safe. For example, she describes how she will provide healthy meals and teach children about road safety.
- Through discussion, the childminder shows a good understanding of working in partnership with parents, as well as other settings that children may attend. This allows for consistency in children's care and learning.
- The childminder talks about how she will respect the uniqueness of each child. She recognises the importance of equality and inclusion. She describes how she intends to teach children about acceptable behaviour using methods that relate to children's age and understanding.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
