Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of keeping children safe and from harm. She knows how to correctly identify children who may be at risk of neglect and abuse. She successfully explains the correct procedures to take to report her concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder describes how she will value children's backgrounds and home experiences. For example, the childminder says she will gather information from parents about children's knowledge and experiences. She explains her plans to recognise important festivals and events and help children to understand different communities and cultures.
- The childminder demonstrates her commitment to her professional development. She keeps her knowledge current of developments and safeguarding issues. The childminder makes use of her links with other organisations to help to develop her service further.
- The childminder explains what she intends children to learn and how she will plan a curriculum to build on what they know and can do. She explains how she will provide support for children of differing ages and abilities. The childminder shares how she will identify gaps in children's learning and development and the importance of sharing information with parents.
- The childminder understands the importance of managing children's behaviour. She confidently describes a range of strategies to help children of different ages to manage their own feelings and behaviour.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
