Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not ensured that she has kept her first-aid certificate up to date. This is a breach of the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage requirements.
- The childminder does not have the required public liability insurance in place. This is a breach of the statutory requirements.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of the importance of assessing children's learning. This includes completing a progress check for children aged two. She is aware of the importance of working in partnership with parents and professionals to support children's future learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of risk assessments and the actions to take to help minimise or remove any hazards to keep children safe.
- The childminder understands the value of helping children learn about expectations for behaviour and how to encourage their independence and self-confidence.
- The childminder understands the value of children having opportunities to learn about the wider world. For example, she knows the importance of supporting children to be respectful, kind to others, to share and be tolerant.
- The childminder knows her responsibility to protect children and keep them safe. She completes regular training to enhance her knowledge of wider safeguarding issues, such as radicalisation and extremism. She understands the procedures to follow if she has concerns about a child's welfare. She knows what to do in the event of an allegation being made against her or a family member, to promote children's safety.
- The childminder knows the importance of supporting children's good health and well-being. She confidently demonstrates the value of daily exercise, fresh air, a healthy diet and promoting good hygiene practices and lifestyles.
- She understands the value of self-evaluation. She attends training to help improve her practice, provision, and continuous professional development to benefit children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the childminder received since COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the childminder and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the childminder.
- The inspector viewed the childminding provision and discussed the safety and suitability of the premises.
- The childminder spoke to the inspector about how she would organise the curriculum.
- The childminder provided the inspector with a sample of key documentation on request, including her paediatric first-aid certificate, public liability insurance and suitability checks for household members.
- The inspector discussed policies and procedures with the provider, which included the arrangements to safeguard and promote children's welfare.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
