Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder keeps her safeguarding knowledge current. She has accessed training to help her identify and respond to signs of possible abuse. The childminder correctly explains the local procedures for reporting her concerns.
- The childminder demonstrates how she will promote children's positive behaviour. She says she will talk calmly to children and help them to show respect for others. The childminder confirms she will encourage children to recognise and value people's similarities and differences and celebrate a range of festivals. She confirms she will promote an inclusive service.
- The childminder confidently explains how she will support children's learning and development. She describes how she will provide a range of challenging experiences to help all children to become keen learners.
- The childminder acknowledges the importance of working in partnership with parents. She describes how she would identify children's initial starting points with parents and assess children's learning and development over time.
- The childminder evaluates her service, and she explains how she strives for continuous improvement. She regularly accesses online training to help to support her continuous professional development. The childminder says she is eager to provide a good quality home-from-home learning environment for all children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
