Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a clear understanding of the early years foundation stage requirements. She understands how children learn and develop and shows a secure knowledge of how she intends to support children's learning, across all areas of the curriculum.
- The childminder has appropriate understanding of how to keep children safe. She knows the correct procedures to follow if she has any concerns about a child's safety or welfare. She also understands her responsibility to report any allegations made against herself. Furthermore, she knows the action she will take if she has any concerns about families being influenced by extremist views or radicalisation.
- The childminder highlights the importance of working closely with parents to ensure key information is shared when new children join. She knows how she intends to keep parents updated about their children's new achievements and progress. In addition, she explains the importance of having open dialogue to ensure that children receive good levels of consistency at home and at their childcare setting.
- Through discussion, the childminder shows a clear understanding of promoting children's health. She discusses the importance of offering a healthy and nutritious range of meals and snacks. Furthermore, she explains how she intends to provide lots of opportunities for children to be active and to learn and play outdoors.
- The childminder shows appropriate knowledge of how to manage children's behaviour. She discusses the importance of giving them encouragement and praise to help to build their self-esteem. Furthermore, she explains how she intends to help children to learn about different feelings and emotions, for instance, through a range of books.
- The childminder understands the value of providing children with a wide range of experiences to develop their social development and broaden their awareness of the wider world. She discusses how she intends to take children on regular outings in the local community. For instance, she plans to visit the library and different play sessions to extend their knowledge of different people and places.
- During discussion, the childminder describes how she intends to observe and assess children's learning and development. She explains how she will identify children's individual interests and use these to help her plan what children need to learn next, to support them to move forward with their learning.
- All mandatory training is now up to date. The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her practice to drive ongoing improvements for the children and families that attend.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
