Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibilities to safeguard children and identify concerns about a child's welfare. She understands the procedures to report any concerns or allegations to the relevant authorities. The childminder holds current public liability insurance and has kept updated about current legislation.
- The childminder understands how to develop and promote children's positive relationships and secure attachments. She has good knowledge of behaviour management and discusses the strategies she has in place to encourage children to be kind and respectful to others. She shows good knowledge and understanding of how to promote equality of opportunity and knows the importance of providing an inclusive practice.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to support children's individual needs. The childminder knows the purpose of gaining detailed information from parents to enable her to support children to make good progress across all areas of learning.
- The childminder demonstrates a sound understanding of how to create challenging learning experiences for children, to support children to make good progress across all areas of learning. She demonstrates how she monitors children's development across all areas of learning and swiftly identifies any gaps in their learning.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the need to evaluate her practice. For example, she has attended training with the local authority and completed online research to develop her knowledge of early years.
- The childminder understands the importance of encouraging children to adopt a healthy lifestyle. For example, by spending time being physically active outdoors in the fresh air, learning about good hygiene skills and healthy eating.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed how the childminder evaluates her practice and provision.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation, including the suitability of members of the household and paediatric first-aid qualifications.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programme for children.
- The inspector had a discussion with the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
