

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 3 and 23 December 2025 and 15 January 2026, the provider notified us about matters relating to safeguarding policies and procedures, concerns about children's safety and welfare, supervision of staff and risk assessment. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted.

On 28 January 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 11 February 2026:

- ensure the written safeguarding policies and procedures are in line with the local safeguarding partnership, including the actions staff are required to take in the event of a safeguarding concern, the process for monitoring referrals, timescales for action, and the steps to follow where concerns need to be escalated
- ensure that all staff, including lead practitioners for safeguarding, understand how to identify and respond to safeguarding concerns about children in a timely way
- ensure that staff, including those who are designated safeguarding leads, undertake annual refresher training to maintain essential safeguarding skills.

On 18 February 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last regulatory event.

We found that the provider had reviewed their written safeguarding policies and procedures so that it clearly outlines the actions staff must take if they have a safeguarding concern. Staff, including those with lead responsibility for safeguarding, have completed training to

ensure they can identify concerns and respond promptly to keep children safe.

We are satisfied that the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
