Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder explains how he intends to plan a wide-ranging curriculum and use his observations of children to plan what children need to learn next. He understands his responsibilities to take prompt action if he identifies any gaps in children's learning to ensure children do not fall behind.
- The childminder explains how he will promote healthy lifestyles and care practices. He knows how to support children to learn to manage their personal care needs. He offers children a broad range of enjoyable activities in his home and garden to help to promote children's physical development.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing good partnerships with parents and other professionals. He explains the importance of sharing information about children's progress with parents and helping them to support children's learning at home.
- The childminder discusses how he will have high expectations for children's behaviour. He is clear about how he will help children to develop positive relationships. The childminder explains how he will incorporate sharing, turn taking and respect for others into children's daily activities.
- The childminder understands how to identify and eliminate potential risks to children to promote their welfare and ensure they can play safely. He has a clear understanding of how to safeguard children and how to seek advice and support should he have a concern.
- The childminder understands the need to evaluate his provision. He is able to explain how he keeps his knowledge up to date and refreshes his skills. For example, he completes mandatory courses and conducts his own online research.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the childminder received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the childminder.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about his childcare practices throughout the inspection to establish his understanding of how to safeguard children.
- The inspector saw the areas of the childminder's home intended for childminding purposes. She checked the suitability of toys and resources available and discussed with the childminder how he monitors children's learning and development.
- The inspector sampled a range of relevant documentation, including the childminder's public liability insurance and training certificates.
- The inspector verified evidence of suitability for the childminder and the adults working and living on the premises.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
