The home was registered on 5 August 2020. There is no registered manager in post.

The purpose of this visit was to monitor the home following concerns raised suggesting that there may be a breach in regulations. These concerns relate to the registered manager, who was recently dismissed from the company.

Ofsted is satisfied that there is no breach of regulations.

The registered manager has been dismissed from his post and no longer works at the home. There are interim arrangements in place, with the operations manager overseeing the home until a new manager is appointed.

Two children are in placement and are settled. Both children have been in education and have regular contact with family and friends. They have not displayed any risk-taking behaviours. There have been no safeguarding concerns raised.

There are no breaches of regulations and no recommendations to be made.
