Information about this children's home

This children's home is owned and run by a private organisation and it provides care for up to two children.

The home and the manager registered with Ofsted on 6 May 2020.

There is one child living at the home currently.

This monitoring visit

At a monitoring visit on 30 March 2021, three compliance notices were issued. A further monitoring visit was completed on 4 May 2021. This visit identified that the provider had made sufficient improvements to meet the actions identified in two of the three compliance notices. A further compliance notice was issued in respect of the behaviour management policy and procedures.

This monitoring visit was conducted to assess the progress made in meeting the compliance notice. A full inspection was also completed immediately after the monitoring visit.

The staff have received positive behaviour management training, and this has improved their skills in keeping children calm and regulated. As a result, there has been no occasion when children have been held or restrained.

The provider could therefore demonstrate that sufficient progress had been made to meet the actions outlined in the compliance notice. The quality of care report had still not been completed and submitted to Ofsted, so this requirement remains in place.

What does the children's home need to do to improve?

Statutory requirements

In order to complete a quality of care review, the registered person must establish and maintain a system for monitoring, reviewing and evaluating— the quality of care provided for children; the feedback and opinions of children about the children's home, its facilities and the quality of care they receive in it; and any actions that the registered person considers necessary in order to improve or maintain the quality of care provided for children. The registered person must— supply to HMCI a copy of the quality of care review report within 28 days of the date on which the quality of care review is completed. The system referred to in paragraph (2) must provide for ascertaining and considering the opinions of children, their parents, placing authorities and staff.
