The quality and standards of the early years provision

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has sufficient knowledge of how children learn. She demonstrates through discussion how to use information from observations to plan activities that focus on their next steps in learning.
- The areas to be used for the care of children are homely, welcoming and accessible to all. Equipment and resources provided are suitable for a range of ages and are easily accessible to all children.
- The childminder demonstrates that she understands how to manage children's behaviour through the use of clear boundaries and giving consistent messages. This will ensure that children know what is expected of them.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children and the procedure to follow in the event of concerns about a child's welfare. She understands the need to ensure children are provided with a safe and secure environment.
- The childminder discusses the value of developing positive partnerships with parents and other professionals to ensure information about children's care and learning is shared. This is so she can ensure that children receive continuity which supports their development.

Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle – the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises and garden to be used for childminding.

The inspector talked to the childminder about her understanding of the learning and development requirements, and the activities she will provide to support children's learning.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements, and the systems she has in place for ensuring children are protected.
- The inspector looked at and discussed policies, procedures and documents the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability of the childminder and her household and talked to the childminder about her self-evaluation and improvement plans.

Information about the setting

The childminder was registered in 1979 and is on the Early Years Register and the compulsory and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. She lives with her husband and two adult children in Peterborough, Cambridgeshire. The childminder has one cat, two guinea pigs, one rabbit and 17 chickens. The whole of the ground floor together with the upstairs bathroom is used for childminding. There is an enclosed garden for outdoor play. She collects children from the local schools. There are currently no children on roll in the early years age range. The childminding provision operates all year round from 7am to 6.30pm, Monday to Friday, except bank holidays and family holidays.

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Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
