Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her role to promote children's safety. She knows the signs and symptoms of child abuse and what to do if she identifies a child may be exposed to harm. The childminder knows how to report any concerns to the relevant agencies.
- The childminder understands the importance of a curriculum that incorporates what children need to achieve to help them with their next stage of learning. The childminder values parents' contributions to ensure that children develop an enthusiasm and curiosity to gain new skills and knowledge. She has a good understanding of child development and can identify when a child may need additional support.
- The childminder is keen to develop her knowledge and skills. She completes required training in a timely manner. For example, she ensures that her paediatric first-aid training is refreshed appropriately. The childminder is reflective and targets training to improve her practice to improve children's outcomes.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting children's emotional well-being. She carefully considers how to best support children to manage their behaviour. For example, she explains how she would encourage children to talk about their feelings, share and take turns.
- The childminder explains how she will provide children with a healthy diet, including regular healthy snacks. She understands the importance of finding out information from parents about children's specific dietary needs when they first start, and of promoting children's health.
- The childminder describes how she encourages children to celebrate diversity and promotes the importance of valuing and respecting each other. She includes various outings and trips to local community groups, where children can extend their understanding of the world around them and of different cultures and beliefs.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents to exchange information about children. This supports a better understanding of children's individual needs and how to promote their learning and development.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the childminder received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the childminder and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The childminder showed the inspector the premises and discussed how she ensures that they are safe and suitable.
- The childminder and the inspector discussed how the childminder organises their early years provision, including the aims and rationale for their early years foundation stage curriculum.
- The childminder provided the inspector with a sample of key documentation on request.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
