Monitoring visit

Information about this children's home

This home is run by a private organisation and is registered to provide care for up to four children who have experienced childhood instability that has resulted in trauma and associated complex behaviours.

The home does not have a registered manager and responsible individual. A new manager was appointed in November 2021. They are in the process of applying to Ofsted to be registered. The responsible individual post is vacant.

This monitoring visit

On 8 October 2021 the provider requested that their conditions of registration be varied to include a condition that they would give Ofsted three months' notice before admitting a child. This monitoring visit has been completed as the provider informed Ofsted of their intention to move a child into the home.

The visit was completed to determine the providers readiness for a child to move in. Following this monitoring visit the responsible individual has resigned from their post on the 18 February 2022. In addition, we have also received concerns regarding both the financial viability of the provider and the permitted use of the premises. Ofsted have requested further information from the provider in relation to these concerns..

A notice of restriction of accommodation has been issued. This means that the provider can not move any children into the home.
