## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibilities to keep children safe and ensure that people living or working on the premises are suitable to be around children. She knows the signs that indicate a child may be at risk of harm and what to do if she is concerned about their welfare.
- The childminder knows how to provide a range of activities to support children's learning and development, and to help them make good progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals, to help meet children's individual needs.
- The childminder recognises the importance of risk assessments to help keep children safe and knows what a potential hazard could be and how to remove it.
- The childminder understands how to support children's physical well-being, such as through a healthy diet and regular exercise. She knows how to encourage children to behave well.
- The childminder recognises the importance of self-evaluation. She knows how to seek the views of others to help her reflect on her service. She understands the importance of developing her skills and knowledge to help improve experiences for children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the childminder received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The inspector viewed a sample of documentation, which the childminder intends to use when children are present, such as her policies and procedures.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about how she evaluates and improves her service.
- The inspector viewed parts of the premises which the childminder intends to use for childcare and discussed how she will keep the environment safe.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her understanding of the statutory requirements.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
