Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. She discusses how she would plan activities that interest and motivate children, and support their learning.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's positive behaviour and self-esteem effectively. She recognises the importance of helping children learn to manage their feelings and help them develop good behaviour. The childminder is aware that this promotes children's well-being and helps them to feel secure.
- Through discussion, the childminder demonstrates how to promote children's health. She understands the benefits of healthy eating and providing children with daily opportunities for exercise and outdoor activities to promote their physical development.
- The childminder appreciates the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to ensure continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder recognises her responsibility to protect children from harm. Through discussion, she knows how to identify signs that children may be at risk, and how to report any concerns, in line with her local safeguarding procedures.
- The childminder understands how to evaluate her practice to identify ways of improving children's experiences.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the childminder received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the childminder and has taken that into account in her evaluation of the setting.
- The childminder and the inspector carried out a learning walk together and discussed how the setting promotes children's learning and development.
- The inspector viewed areas of the house used to care for children.
- The inspector viewed relevant documentation, including the childminder's paediatric first-aid certificate.
- The inspector talked to the childminder about how she reflects on her practice.
