Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a sound understanding of the known indicators of child abuse and neglect. She explains she will keep a record of any concerns and report these to the relevant agencies with statutory responsibility without delay.
- The childminder understands how to plan for children's learning and development to help them make progress and prepare them for starting school. She understands the importance of working closely with parents to find out about what children know and can do when they start in her care. She recognises the relevance of observing children and assessing their progress, and planning for what they need to learn next. The childminder understands how to complete the required assessments.
- The childminder's home and garden are safe and secure. She understands how to risk assess the environment to ensure it is suitable for children's use. The home is clean and well maintained. Safe and stimulating resources are provided for children to engage in play and learning activities when they begin to attend.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting children's good health. She describes how she will ensure they exercise and engage in physical activities each day and spend time in the fresh air. The childminder is aware of the importance of promoting a healthy balanced diet with children. She will help them to learn about the needs of their own developing bodies.
- In order to promote children's emotional well-being, the childminder recognises the importance of offering settling-in arrangements that are tailored to meet children's individual needs. She will encourage positive behaviours, including teaching all children to be respectful of each other, to share and take turns.
- The childminder recognises the importance of developing close working relationships with parents, other providers, and professionals. She intends to work with others to ensure she can meet children's needs, particularly for those with special educational needs and/or disabilities.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The was the first routine inspection the childminder received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the childminder and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The childminder gave the inspector a tour of her home and showed the inspector the range of resources, toys and equipment for children's learning, development, care, and safety.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about how she intends to meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage, and develop her knowledge and understanding further.
- The childminder shared a selection of required records and documentation with the inspector.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
