Information about this children's home

This privately owned home provides care for up to 2 children with emotional, social and special educational support needs, including learning disabilities.

The manager registered with Ofsted in June 2022.

At the time of this inspection, there were no children living at the home.

This monitoring visit

This home was judged as inadequate following a full inspection on 4 and 5 November 2025. Shortfalls in safeguarding children, and the leadership and management of the home were identified. Children's plans failed to show an understanding of a child's specific needs and were not individualised. As a result, 3 compliance notices were served relating to the protection of children, the leadership and management of the home and care planning.

A monitoring visit was conducted on 10 December 2025. The purpose of this visit was to review the actions taken to meet the steps as set out in the in the compliance notices. It was identified that the provider has met the required steps.

There were no children living at the home as the child had moved out before the last inspection.

Leaders and managers have ensured that staff have access to specialist training. This has provided the staff with the knowledge and skills to meet the children's needs. In addition, leaders and managers have set out a training plan for the year to ensure all staff have monthly training on individual safeguarding subjects which will support

their continued learning and provide them with a better understanding of and confidence in managing safeguarding concerns.

Leaders and managers have provided staff with competency based questionnaires. The registered manager will explore these in staff supervision sessions along with any areas that would benefit from further development. Further group supervisions and team training sessions are planned which will enhance continued professional development and improve the quality of care provided at the home.

Leaders and managers have all undertaken designated safeguarding lead training to ensure there is always a safeguarding lead available. The registered manager has created flow charts for staff to have simple and accessible guidance directing them when a safeguarding concern arises.

Leaders and managers have reviewed the children's plans to include the child's views and to ensure that they demonstrate a clear understanding of the child. They provide guidance to staff in supporting the child in the way that best suits them. This provides the child with individualised care and improves the management of risks.

Leaders and managers have ensured that all staff have a better understanding of children moving to the home by developing a preadmission process which demonstrates increased professional curiosity. This will aid leaders and managers when making decisions about children's moves to the home and ensure that these are in the scope of the home's statement of purpose.

Due to there not being a child at the home at the time of inspection, the inspector was unable to review 1 of the requirements issued at the previous inspection, therefore this has been restated.

Statutory requirements

ensure that the views of each relevant person are taken into account, so far as reasonably practicable, before making a decision about the care or welfare of a child.
