Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how children learn. She explains how she will provide children with a range of experiences based on their interests and developmental needs, to develop their learning in all areas. The childminder discusses how she will plan trips outside the home, for example, to local parks and toddler groups, to broaden children's experiences.
- The childminder explains her high expectations for children she will care for. She describes her positive approach to supporting children's good behaviour. The childminder talks about how she will support children's behaviour and emotional development. She understands how to teach children to be respectful and kind to one another.
- The childminder recognises the importance of providing children with fresh air each day and a variety of opportunities to practise their physical skills. Through discussion, she shows how she will encourage healthy eating and good dental hygiene.
- Through discussion, the childminder shows an understanding of the importance of building relationships with parents. For example, the childminder describes how she will communicate with parents through conversations and share information about their children's progress.
- The childminder describes how she will support children to develop individually, including those children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. She discusses how she will refer to outside agencies for additional support with children's learning and development, if needed.
- The childminder keeps up to date with mandatory training, such as paediatric first aid and safeguarding.
- The childminder understands her safeguarding responsibilities to protect children from harm. She knows the procedures to follow if she has concerns about a child's well-being. The childminder attends regular safeguarding training. This helps to keep her knowledge current and to understand a range of safeguarding issues that may affect children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements when caring for children.
