Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has improved her knowledge of safeguarding children. She explains her safeguarding policies and procedures, which are in line with the local safeguarding partners. This includes the procedures to follow if an allegation is made against her or an adult living in the household. She demonstrates the importance of risk assessment to enhance children's safety.
- The childminder demonstrates a suitable understanding of her responsibility to promote children's learning and development. For example, she describes how she will identify children's starting points and use observations and assessments to plan and support learning. This includes completing a written review of the progress check for children aged between two and three years, which she will share with parents.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of working together with parents and other professionals involved in children's care. This helps to promote continuity for children and support their learning.
- Through discussion, the childminder explains how she will promote children's health and well-being. For example, she will ensure children are provided with healthy and nutritious meals. The childminder is aware of the importance of considering children's dietary requirements and allergies. She knows the importance of encouraging good hygiene practices. The childminder understands the value of children accessing exercise and leading a healthy lifestyle, to help promote their well-being.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear knowledge of how to support children's behaviour and emotional development. She understands and describes how she will teach children to share, be respectful and kind to one another.
- The childminder recognises the importance of maintaining her professional development and shares how she regularly updates her childcare knowledge and training. She describes how she will evaluate her provision to improve outcomes for children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
