Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider maintains accurate records. She carefully designs policies and procedures to inform staff of her expectations. The provider understands the importance of providing an environment that supports children's interests and developmental needs.
- The provider recognises the importance of having high expectations for children and promoting their independence. She describes how children will be involved as 'helper of the day' in setting the table for meals. The provider explains how children will be encouraged to be involved in tidying up and taking care of the environment.
- The provider is aware of the need to provide children with opportunities to learn about leading healthy lifestyles. The provider describes how she will involve children in designing menus to educate them about creating balanced diets. She talks about the outings children will be involved in that would allow them to be physically active in a variety of ways. The provider explains that these will include trips to miniature golf, bowling and local parks.
- The provider understands the importance of promoting children's positive behaviour within the setting. She describes how children will be involved in designing rules, which will be discussed before every session. The provider discusses strategies, such as using sand timers, to help children to begin to manage taking turns independently.
- The provider recognises the importance of building positive relationships with parents. The provider describes how staff will gather information when children join the provision and use this to ensure that children's individual needs are met. She explains that staff will provide parents with verbal feedback at the end of each session.
- The provider understands the importance of making reasonable adjustments to ensure that children with special educational needs and/or disabilities can access the provision.
- The provider describes how diversity will be celebrated. She discusses how children will learn the importance of developing tolerance, empathy and respect towards others. The provider talks about giving children the opportunity to make choices and develop their own views and opinions.
- The provider understands the importance of being reflective in her practice. She describes the ways in which she continues to invest in her own and staff's professional development and training.
- The provider undertakes regular safeguarding training. She has a secure understanding of keeping children safe from harm and abuse. There are clear procedures in place for recording and reporting concerns. The provider understands how to deal with allegations against herself or any other staff members within the setting.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
