Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of child development. She has a range of interesting and stimulating resources. The childminder explains how she will ensure that children's learning needs are met through regular observations and assessments.
- The childminder understands how to keep the children in her care safe. She is able to recognise the possible signs and symptoms of abuse and how to report any concerns. The childminder describes how she will carry out risk assessments around the home and before outings. She will also promote children's understanding of keeping themselves safe when out and about.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing good relationships with parents. She will provide detailed feedback and ensure she maintains consistent communication. The childminder explains how she will ensure parents feel well supported through any transitions. For example, toilet training and how she will support their children through this.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of children's good health. For example, she will provide children with healthy meals and snacks. The childminder also explains how she will promote children's physical health through active play.
- The childminder describes how she will support children's positive behaviour. She will help children to have a clear understanding of expectations and rules. The childminder explains how she will ensure children understand the value of good manners.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities
