Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a clear understanding of safeguarding. He knows the possible signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect and how to refer any concerns to the relevant authorities. Daily checks and risk assessments of his home help the childminder to identify and remove any potential hazards to children.
- The childminder explains how he uses a range of teaching skills to meet children's individual learning styles and to support his curriculum. He has systems in place to observe and to monitor children's progress and to swiftly identify any gaps in their learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and other settings children may also attend. This helps continuity of care and learning, helping children to make good progress.
- The childminder is aware to evaluate his assistant's practice as well as his own, to help develop their skills and keep their good knowledge up to date.
- The childminder has a range of suitable resources for children of all age ranges and knows how to positively manage children's behaviour effectively.
- The childminder explains how he and his assistant build secure bonds with children to promote their emotional well-being and independence.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
