Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibility to protect children and to keep them safe at all times. She is aware of the possible signs and symptoms that may indicate that a child's welfare is at risk. The childminder completes regular safeguarding training to improve her knowledge. She understands how to refer any concerns about children's welfare to the relevant external agencies.
- The childminder explains how she will ensure that children's learning needs are met through regular observations and assessments. She describes how she will plan for children's next steps in learning and understands how to support children who may need additional help with their development.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing children with a broad and fully inclusive curriculum. She explains how she will teach children to develop independence, self-care skills and social confidence, in readiness for school.
- The childminder understands the importance of encouraging children to follow healthy lifestyles and develop good hygiene routines. For example, she describes how she will plan daily opportunities for children to be physically active outside.
- The childminder knows the importance of undertaking risk assessments to minimise hazards and ensure that children are kept safe at all times. She is aware of the importance of teaching children how to manage their own safety.
- The childminder explains how she will help children to manage their behaviour. She describes how she will teach children to manage their feelings, be kind and respect each other's differences.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to help promote consistency and continuity of children's care and learning.
- The childminder knows the importance of maintaining her training and skills. She strives for continuous improvement and values feedback from parents and other professionals about all aspects of her practice and provision.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the childminder received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the childminder and has taken this into account in their evaluation of the childminder.
- The childminder showed the inspector around the premises and discussed how she ensures that they are safe and suitable for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programme for children.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation, including paediatric first-aid certificates and suitability checks for the childminder.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
