Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is passionate about providing children with the best opportunities for quality early education. She is articulate and talks enthusiastically about providing a curriculum that is ambitious and challenging, ensuring children are engaged in their learning and are ready for the next stage of their learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of observing and monitoring children's development. She has secure knowledge of the different areas of learning and how she will inclusively promote these within her setting. The childminder is confident in the process to follow should she have concerns about a child's development.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting children's independence and having high expectations. She describes how she will provide children with opportunities to problem-solve independently, developing skills of resilience.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles to children and families. The childminder describes how she will involve children in growing and baking activities. Food will be freshly prepared and nutritionally balanced. Children will have opportunities for regular exercise in the communal-gated gardens and walks within the local area.
- The childminder recognises the importance of building positive and professional relationships with parents. She describes how she will create open channels of communication to ensure parents feel well informed about their children's learning and development.
- The childminder understands the importance of creating an environment that celebrates the uniqueness of every child and family. She describes how British values will be promoted. The childminder talks about how she will create an environment where children's rights and opinions are respected and valued.
- The childminder continues to invest in her own professional development. She attends regular training and keeps up to date with best practice. The childminder recognises the importance of seeking regular feedback from parents and other professionals.
- The childminder has a robust understanding of safeguarding. She has completed regular training and, through discussion, understands her responsibility for keeping children safe from harm or abuse. The childminder ensures, through regular risk assessment, that the indoor and outdoor environment remains suitable for all children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector and childminder held discussions around the learning and welfare requirements.
- Discussions were held to ascertain the childminder's knowledge around safeguarding.
